



## Jeff Vogel Appointed as Advisor to the Graduate School of Banking at Colorado Board of Trustees



The Graduate School of Banking at Colorado (GSBC) is pleased to announce the appointment of Jeff Vogel, Wyoming State Banking Commissioner, as an advisor to the GSBC Board of Trustees.

Jeffrey C. Vogel was appointed as the Wyoming Division of Banking State Banking Commissioner in February 2002. Vogel heads the Division of Banking in the Department of Audit. He was the Deputy Banking Commissioner at the time of his appointment and brings more than 25 years of regulatory experience to the Commissioner's position. Prior to becoming a bank examiner, Vogel worked for the Wyoming State Examiner as a Public Funds auditor and a Wyoming oil and gas exploration and development company as an accountant. As Commissioner, Vogel is responsible for the supervision and regulation of 25 state chartered banks, three independent trust companies and 1600 licensed non-depository financial entities operating in Wyoming.

During his tenure as Deputy Commissioner, Vogel played an integral role in the development and implementation of the interstate bank coordinated examination process, worked with the Commissioner to modernize Wyoming's banking statutes and regulations, effected the national re-accreditation of the Division of Banking with the Conference of State Bank Supervisors (CSBS) in Washington, D.C., and promoted extensive use of technology in the bank examination process to expedite examination activities and reduce on-site examination time.

Vogel served as the Immediate Past Chairman of the Board of the Conference of State Bank Supervisors in 2008 and served as its Chairman in 2007. At CSBS, Vogel previously held offices of Chairman-elect, Vice Chairman and Secretary. In addition, he serves on the Board of Trustees of the organization's Education Foundation of the State Bank Supervisors and currently chairs the CSBS Regulatory Policy Committee.

Vogel, a Certified Examinations Manager, received his Bachelor of Science Degree in Accounting from the University of Wyoming in 1983, and is a 1993 graduate of the Graduate School of Banking at Colorado. He and his wife Kathy have two sons, Sam and Chase.

The Graduate School of Banking at Colorado will host its 61<sup>st</sup> Annual School Session July 10-22, 2011 on the University of Colorado campus in Boulder, Colorado.
